We're so glad you could join us for worship this morning. Please note the following precautions we are taking to provide a safe and encouraging experience for all worshipers today (which may vary slightly depending on which service you are attending).

Seating: As we practice social distancing, it is essential that we each honor the comfort level of our fellow worshipers. Maintain approximately 6 feet of space between you and others with whom you are not regularly exposed (e.g., family). Only sit in the seats that are not marked off by tape. Large families may require a full row so it would be helpful to seek a row that already has someone else in it to leave room for whole rows for families as you are able.

Ministering to children: We are prayerfully considering best practices for re-establishing discipleship opportunities for our children. At present, we are not offering our Children's Church, nursery, or Sunday school classes on Sunday mornings. The nursery is available for parents and their youngest children at any point during the service should you need it. There are sections marked off with tape in the Nursery to help provide social distancing for you and your child. You are encouraged to bring your own toys, snacks, diapers, etc. since all nursery items will be removed. We thank God for every child and would be delighted to have your child in the sanctuary worshiping with us. Let's celebrate the little extra noise as a reminder of God's covenant faithfulness!

General Health: If you or a family member have had a temperature in the last week, experienced any symptoms of illness, or been exposed to someone with Covid-19 in the last 2 weeks, please return home and seek medical guidance on a safe return with us. If you begin to cough, please cover your mouth with the mask.

Masks: Mask wearing is *required* when entering and exiting the building and whenever singing for the 9 a.m. service. It is *recommended* when entering and exiting the 10:45 service but *required* during singing portions of the service. If you cannot wear a mask due to various health reasons, simply refrain from singing.

Exiting the Service: Please exit the building immediately following the benediction and continue fellowship in the parking lot at a safe distance.

THE VOICE OF THE MARTYRS is a nonprofit, interdenominational Christian missions organization dedicated to serving our persecuted family worldwide through practical and spiritual assistance and leading other members of the body of Christ into fellowship with them. VOM was founded in 1967 by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand, who was imprisoned for 14 years in Communist Romania for his faith in Christ; his wife, Sabina, was imprisoned for three years. In 1965 they were ransomed out of Romania, and soon thereafter they established the global network of missions of which VOM is a part. The Wurmbrands based these missions on Hebrews

13:3, which instructs us to "Remember the prisoners as if chained with them—those who are mistreated—since you yourselves are in the body also."

The Voice of the Martyrs serves heavily in nations with persistent and severe persecution, defining them as "Restricted Nations" and "Hostile Areas":

RESTRICTED NATION

Countries where government-sanctioned circumstances or anti-Christian laws lead to Christians being harassed, imprisoned, killed, or deprived of possessions & liberties because of their witness.

HOSTILE AREA

Nations where governments attempt to provide protection for the Christian population but where Christians are routinely persecuted by family, friends, neighbors, or political groups.
